Make your way up the big opposing flakes with tricky footwork.

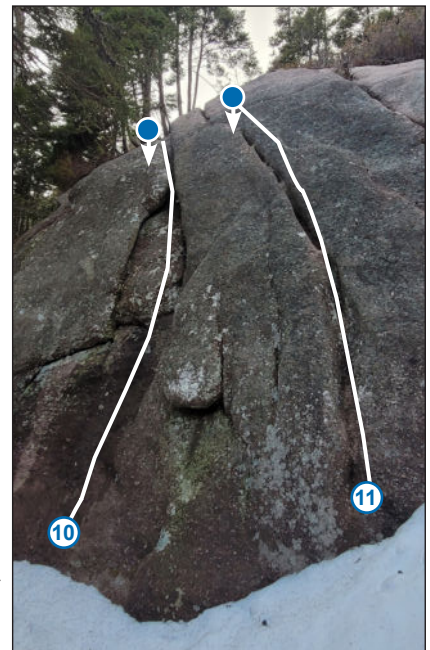

**Approach:** To reach the *Purity Slab*, continue along the flagged trail for 150m instead of going all the way up to the *Main Slab*; the wall will come into view after a short descent down some log stairs.





**The Oasis South**  

**3a. Fade to Black** 5.12a ★★★  



Start by pulling a roof on relatively good holds, leading into an odd boulder problem. Break left after the boulder problem to follow the incredible face to the top

**3b. Daniels Route** 5.11d ★★★  

Start as for *Fade to Black*, but continue straight up the easier, but excellent crack.

**3c. Dog's Breakfast** 5.11c ★  

Classic Newfoundland style, with a ground crux leading to fun, easier climbing. .

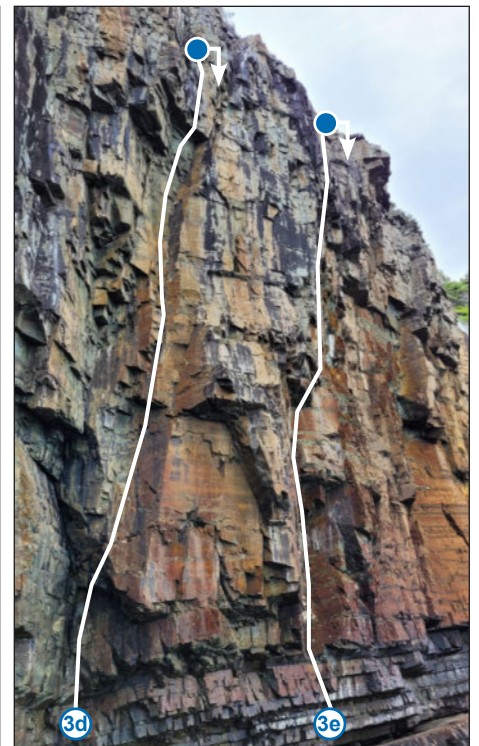
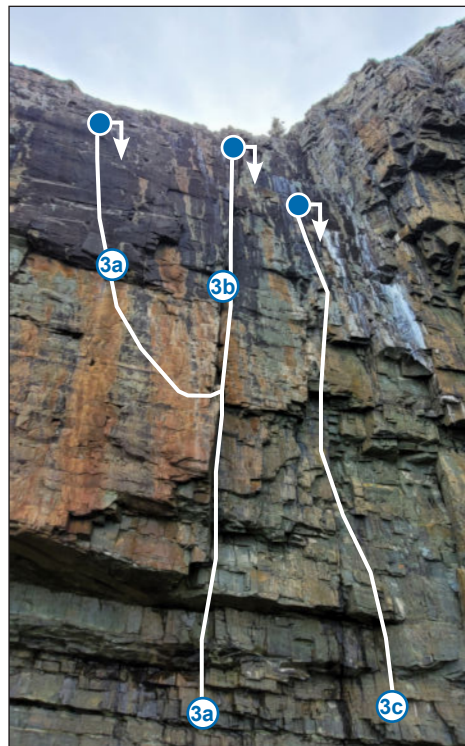

For the next two routes, make sure to have the draws clipped as directionals if you are top-roping - the sharp edges down low may pose a risk if you don't have any directionals clipped.

**3d. The Big Splash** 5.10c ★★★  

Climb the series of intimidating right-leaning corners with lots of big holds.

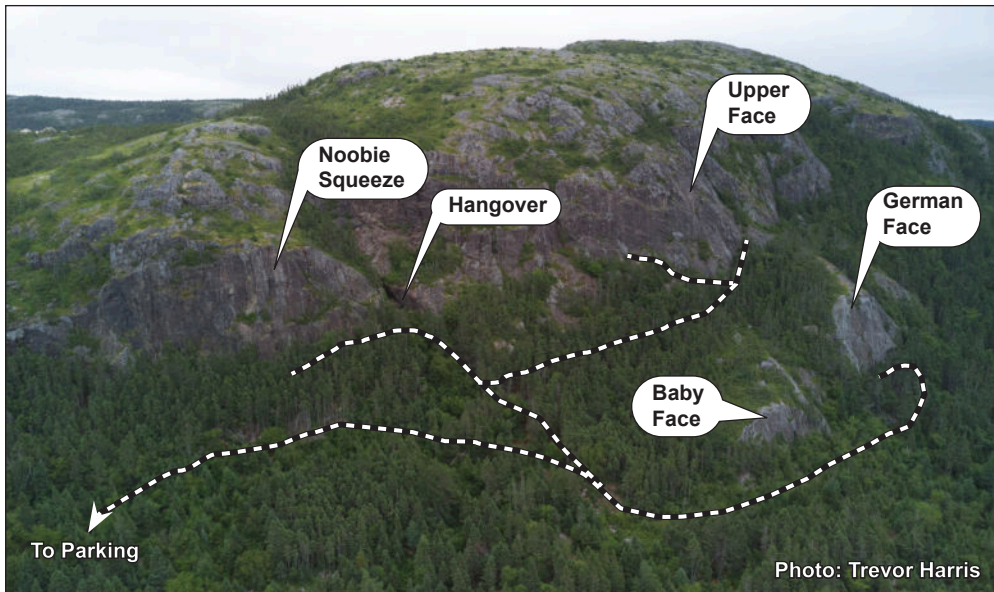

**Baby Face**



**0. Pacifier** 5.6 ★

Shares the first bolt with *Boston Mantle*, then heads left following the crack. Mantle over the bulge and head to the top.

**0. Soft Bail** 5.9 PG13 ★★

Climbs left of the lightning bolt crack.

**Murray's Peak**  

**2. Novice Driver** 5.8 ★★★ 

**Pitch 1 (5.6, 32m):** Slab climbing with closely-spaced bolts. **10 Bolts**

**Pitch 2 (5.8, 30m):** Steeper slab climbing off the belay. Lessens in angle after 4 bolts or so. **11 Bolts**

**Descent:** (1) Two rappels with a 70m rope. Or (2) a brief scramble to the lookout (stay roped up), and follow the hiking trail down.

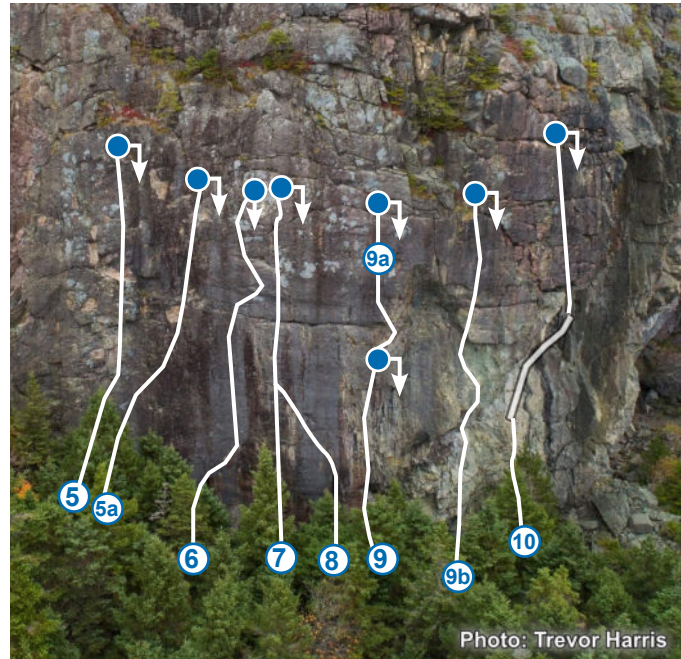

**Dino's Bluff Slab**  

**5a. Plateau** 5.10d ★★★ 

Shares a start (but not bolts) with *Griptodon*. Head right through easing face climbing to a large ledge. Then, puzzling climbing leads up the steeper wall to the top.

**9a. Tipping the Scales** 5.12d ★★★ 

Brutal extension to *Scales or Feathers*. Expect continuous crimping with some challenging clips once you leave the no-hands rest.

**9b. The Great Dying** 5.12c ★★★ 

A physically and mentally challenging route with roof pulls, crimping vertical climbing and a wild, overhanging headwall. Make sure to bring some long slings to extend the third and fourth bolts under the roof.

**11. Deinochierous** 5.12b ★★★

Bouldery moves past a few bolts lead to a good rest out left. Then head right through fun, blocky overhangs with two tough sequences back-to-back. The FA used every inch of his 6' 2" wingspan to make the moves, but shorter climbers have since found a way.

**12. Littlefoot** 5.12d ★★★

Climb up the broken corner using kneebars until the bolt line pulls you out right into a challenging boulder problem through a bulge. Continue rightwards through another bulge leading to a really cool headwall.

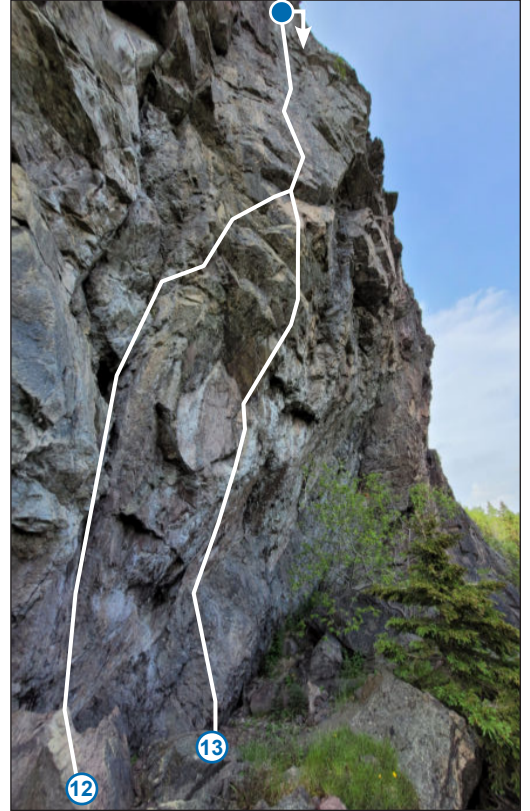

**13. Land Before Time**

**Project 5.13c/d ★★★**

Amazing. Start off on steep crimpy moves, leading to an ok rest. Fire the incredible boulder problem up the steeply overhanging prow and merge into the final bulge and headwall of the previous route.

**2a. Hello Kitty** 5.10d ★★

Follow mostly good holds and cracks up the balancy face, then step right into the finish of *Calvin*.

**4a. Slice of Pi** 5.11a ★★

Direct start to *Richard Parker*. Face climb up to the arete, then continue into the finish of *Richard Parker*.

**8a. Temptations** 5.12c ★

Stick clip the first and second bolt. The tempting arch feature leads to a dead end; make an early exit to the diagonal crack to the left.

**9a. Cat Attack Project** 5.13a/b ★★

An overhanging fingertip crack with a tough start and huge moves through the middle.

**Pink Cliff**

Crag: 48.941256°N, 57.854345°W

This area (besides the first route) requires roped scrambling to access. *The Sickle Project* has a decent belay ledge at the start.

**7a. The Sickle Project** 5.14? ★★★

Good luck! Once through the easy start and juggy roof pull, you'll encounter lots of diagonal slopers without much opposition. Once these slopers end, there is a puzzling section that seems to lead to more straightforward crimping to the top.

Page 238: The "apparently solid" flake mentioned on the fourth pitch of *Log Driver's Waltz* appears to have fallen off in the Fall of 2025. Nobody has climbed the route since; if you do, it is probably safest to climb the *Catch of the Day* variation.

**6. Board Meeting** 5.13a ★★★

Climb the steeply overhanging panel with lots of dynamic moves. Kind of like a long Kilter Board climb; very fun.

Page 256: One new route at North Shore Variety.

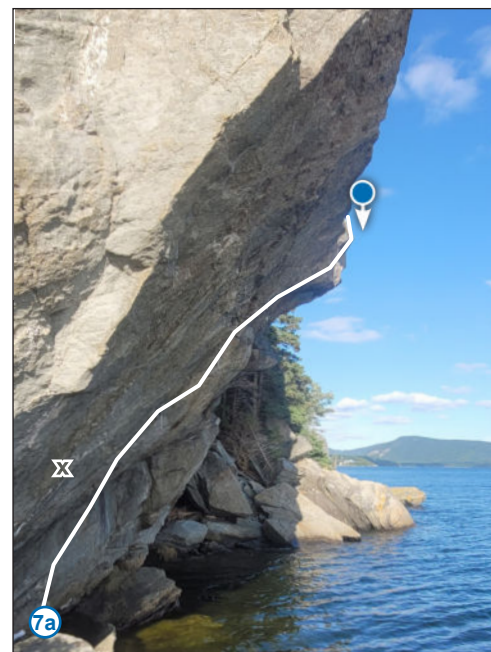
**North Shore Sea Wall**

Access this route by wading through the water left of *Sea Lurchin'*. This will be easier at low tide.

**7a. Shark Smile** 5.12d ★★

Clip the bolt above the belay boulder (this keeps the belayer in place) and also stick clip the first bolt of the climb. Climb the vicious seam splitting the 45 degree wall to a decent shake, then puzzle your way through the crimps in the final overhang. Continue up easy ground to anchor.

Western Region: New route at Penguin Head

# Penguin Head



Crag: 49.146366°N, 57.987859°W

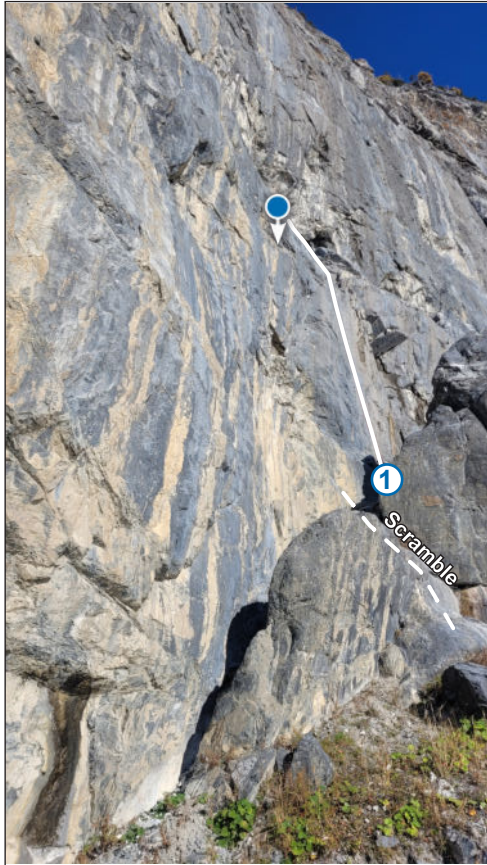
This route is on the cliff above the left side of the talus slope. Access by scrambling up easy ledges.

## 1. Penguin Egg 5.10a

Climb the nice corner in the grey rock past a tricky section. Head up the easy slab to an anchor at the left side of the cave.

## 8. Leviathan (II) 5.11b/12a Top 75

**Pitch 1 (5.10a, 52m):** At the easternmost end of the traverse ledge, climb the beautiful finger crack on the left to the thin face above, protected by a single bolt. Head for the shallow left-facing corner directly above. Climb this and exit left to a small belay stance (**gear belay**).

**Pitch 3 (5.10a, 42m):** Directly above the belay, climb the crack to its end. Face climb **past a bolt**, then undercling left to a finger crack in a small right facing corner. **At the end of this crack follow the under clings left, then go straight up over a small roof followed by a dihedral to gain the belay ledge.**

**Pitch 10 (Easy 5th):** Climb the slabs to the top of the wall (**gear belay**).
